WINTER DANCE Cess.


Thanks to all parents, carers and staff who helped make the Winter Dance a HUGE success.

What to do if your child is off sick—but feels a little better

A couple of parents have asked what they can do with their child while they are off sick. By this they mean if they are feeling a little bit better or have had a stomach bug which means they have to have two days off or they have covid without any symptoms. Obviously as a staff team we would not expect or want children to do any school work if they are poorly. They need to rest and recuperate.

However if you find yourself at home with your child, or they are at Grandparents while you work, here are a few things you can do with them.

Read books, lots of books — picture books are also great—children can be asked lots of questions about the pictures and can extend their vocabulary at the same time.

Draw or colour with them. Mindfulness sheets are very good for fine motor control and peaceful times.

Look on the school website at what the class is learning about this term in the foundation subjects

e.g. History—The Vikings and do some research with them. They can bring that into school when they return and show their teacher.

If your child feels up to it they can also access the online learning platforms such as Purple Mash, Times Table Rockstars, Spelling Shed to name but a few. Limit the time they spend on their tablets etc so they access other things.

It is up to you what they do and how much. But we hope this helps.
