Some comments / Scores require a little unpicking—you said:

1% disagree re clubs and the comment: Never done a club and am unsure about my child's progression in reading. [Our reply: Clubs are not run for the children in EYFS as we think they are too young. Please ask your child's class teacher for further information in reading.](#)

More written homework and challenge for the more advanced. Also avoid mixing grades. [Our reply: We will look into this and get back to you. Where possible we do not mix year groups for core curriculum but as a 1.5 form entry we do have mix year groups for other subjects—but it is planned appropriately.](#)

Better acknowledgments and rewards for children individually—life isn't always part of a team. [Our reply: All children are rewarded/acknowledged individually this is done via their owl points certificates and badge, certificates for TTR/ Hot Chocolate Friday / Spelling shed / Writer of the week / as well as stickers, owl points and termly house competitions e.g. science week and poetry slam. However, we also think it is important to instil in our children a sense of community and working together which is achieved through the owl points for house events such as sports day / red day and our work for the charities we support.](#)
